Cultures:

Intimacy (Pursuing God and each other)

- We have been invited by God into the most fulfilling relationship with Him that we could ever imagine. He is full of love, mercy, and grace, and through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we have been given access to this intimacy with Him.
